

The mission of the San Joaquin County Office of Emergency Services and the SJReady program is to support a prepared and resilient community and improve emergency management capabilities to protect those who live, work and play in San Joaquin County. SJReady encourages residents to make a plan, build an emergency kit, stay informed and get involved. Everyone should have basic supplies on hand that are inexpensive and easy to find in order to survive several days if an emergency occurs. It is important that individuals review this list and consider the unique needs of their family, including seniors and pets, for items to include. It is impossible to predict where and when an emergency occurs, so it is best to prepare supplies for home, work and vehicles.

To stay informed, San Joaquin County residents are encouraged to sign up for SJReady Alerts, a community notification system to alert residents about emergency events and other important public safety information. To sign up, visit: SJReady.org/Stay-Informed.html

Recommended Items to Include in a Basic Emergency Supply Kit:

- Water and non-perishable food for several days
- Extra cell phone battery or charger
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio that can receive NOAA Weather Radio tone alerts and extra batteries
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air, and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Non-sparking wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Can opener (if kit contains canned food)
- Local maps

Additional Items to Consider:

- Prescription medications and glasses
- Infant formula and diapers
- Pet food, water and supplies for your pet
- Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records in a portable waterproof container
- Cash and change
- Emergency reference material such as a first aid book or information from SJReady.org
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person. Consider additional bedding during the colder months.
- Complete change of clothing including a long sleeved shirt, long pants and sturdy shoes. Consider additional clothing during the colder months.
- Fire extinguisher
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Feminine supplies, personal hygiene items and hand sanitizer
- Mess kits, paper cups, plates, disposable utensils and paper towels
- Paper and pencil
- Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children
